




Keynote Speaker: Chuck DeGroat

I'm a follower of Jesus, a husband to Sara for 29 years, and a father to two amazing daughters. I serve as Professor of Counseling and Christian Spirituality and Executive Director of the Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program at Western Theological Seminary Holland, Michigan. I'm also a faculty member for the Soul Care Institute.

I'm a licensed therapist, a spiritual director, author of five books, and retreat leader/speaker. As a therapist, I've specialized in issues of abuse and trauma, pastoral (and leadership) health, and navigating issues of doubt and dark nights on the faith journey. I'm also a Minister of Word and Sacrament in the Reformed



Church in America. I pastored in Orlando and San Francisco before transitioning to training and forming pastors. I also train clergy in issues of abuse and trauma, conduct pastor and planter assessments, and facilitate church consultations and investigations of abuse among pastors and within congregations.

My newest book is coming in early October and is available for pre-order now. It's called Healing What's Within: Coming Home to Yourself and to God When You're Weary, Wounded, and Wandering.

KELLY KAPIC - BREAKOUT SESSION: Affirming the Full Humanity of Ministers: Developing an Imagination for Sustainable Ministry

Kelly M. Kapic is Professor of Theological Studies at Covenant College where he has taught since 2001. With a PhD in Systematic and Historical Theology from King's College University of London, Kapic has written or edited over fifteen books. with His newest book, You're Only Human: How Your Limits Reflect God's Design and Why that's Good News, in 2022 has won a number of awards, including Christianity Today's Book of the Year award in the category of Theology (Popular) and The Southwestern Journal of Theology's award in Applied Theology/Ethics. His earlier work includes Embodied Hope: A Theological Meditation on Pain and Suffering, which also won the Christianity Today book of the year award in the area



of Theology and Ethics and World Magazine's Short List award for Accessible Theology Book of the year. He also recently completed two volumes with the economist Brian Fikkert called *Becoming Whole*: Why the Opposite of Poverty isn't the American Dream and A Field Guide to Becoming Whole: Principles for Poverty Alleviation Ministries. In 2014, Kapic received a Templeton Grant to be part of The Center for Christian Thought studying the topic of Psychology and Spiritual Formation. Currently he serves as part of the Core Research Teams for the Templeton funded studies called "Project Amazing Grace" and "Christian Meaning-Making, Suffering and the Flourishing Life."
